Context | Conflict and vulnerability in South & East Darfur

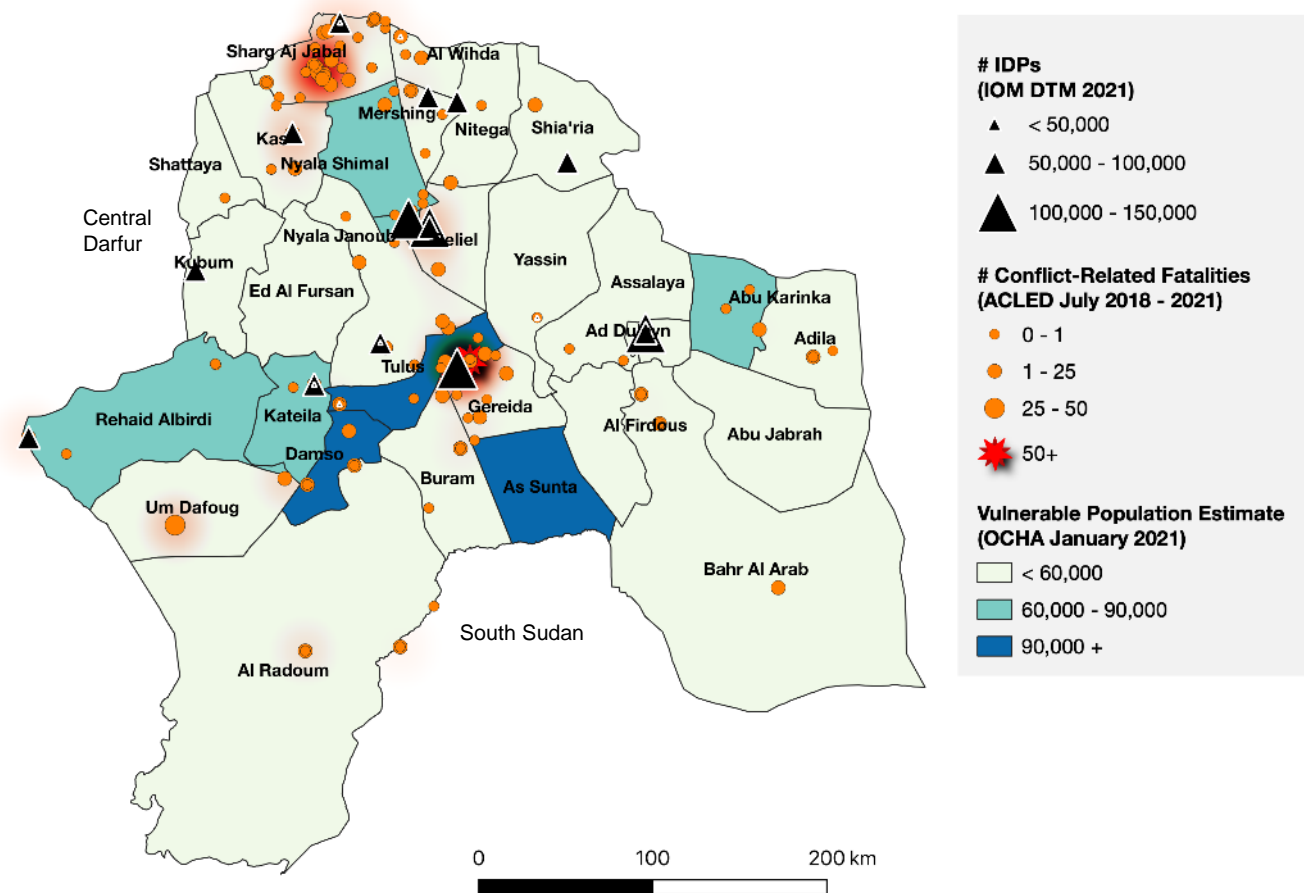
Much of Darfur today remains a post-conflict setting, characterized by fragile public institutions, challenged by criminality, as well as sexual and gender-based violence / conflict-related violence (SGBV-CRSV), a protracted humanitarian crisis and a lack of development.

South Darfur is currently hosting the largest number of internally displaced persons (IDPs) who are largely still unable to return to their areas of origin due to denial of access to their land and competition over natural resources.

Conflict continues between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the Sudan Liberation Army-Abdul Wahid (SLA-AW) and between different factions within the SLA. South Darfur continues to experience significant intercommunal conflict that is mainly driven by competition over natural resources as well as economic and livelihood opportunities, land ownership, movement of people, and a lack of sense of community. The main migratory routes for the herders

UNICEF is supporting the transition of South Darfur from protracted conflict and crisis to recovery and sustainable peace. It is also supporting ad hoc humanitarian response largely to insecurity, disease outbreaks and floods.

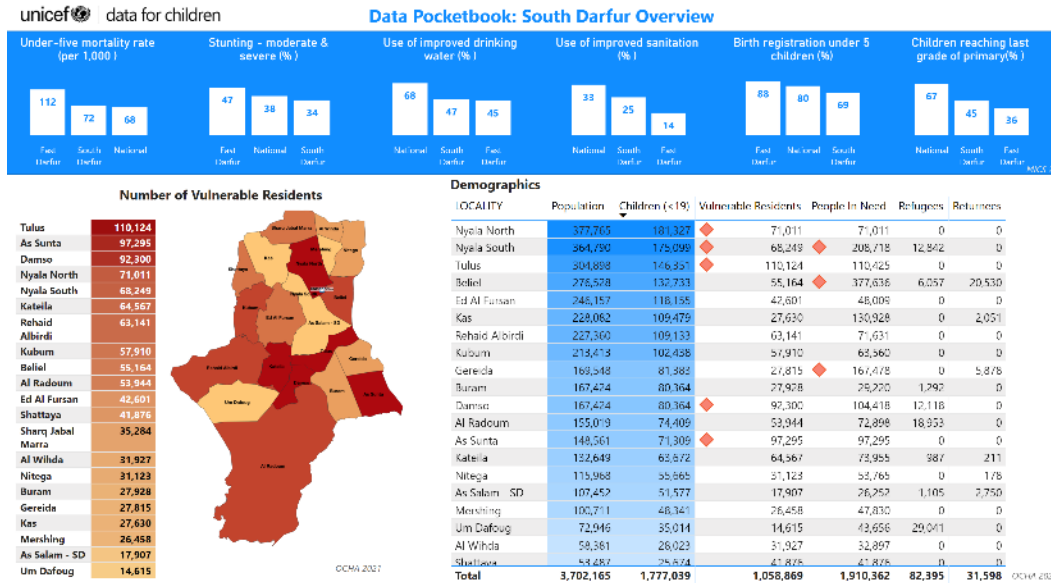
